## What is the JSNA?

- An analyses of data to show the health and well-being needs of local communities & identify inequalities
- The purpose is to
  - inform commissioning decisions
  - shape the future investment and disinvestment of services
  - use the views of the local community to identify need and priorities
  - underpin future Local Area Agreements and the Community Strategy


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


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## Population Change 2006-2016 by key age groups




## Projections of the Proportion of Total Population 80 years or Older 2006-2031






 Other areas looked at include: Homelessness, pensioners living alone, employment, car ownership, access to central heating.



- Example: Dementia Forecast of estimated prevalence of dementia in Surrey by age group (2006-2016)


- Health care acquired infections

## **Access to Services**

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




- People with complex needs increasing numbers requiring services
- **Dementia** increasing numbers requiring services
- Carers estimated almost 100,000 people in Surrey providing care to family/friend/neighbour
- **Sexual health services** access has improved, but need to increase no. of patients seen within 48 hrs and proportion of clients offered long acting reversible contraception
- Place of death Surrey has lower rate of deaths at home compared to England
- Immunisations

## **Vulnerable Groups**

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#### Children in Need

 Most frequent reasons for child protection plans and for becoming looked after are abuse/neglect, family stress and dysfunction

## Gypsy travellers

Estimated to be 2<sup>nd</sup> largest ethnic minority in Surrey, more at risk of ill health

#### Prisoners

 Health issues relating to substance misuse, communicable diseases, mental health, smoking, sexual health problems

#### Sex workers

Use of substances, limited access to services, exploitation and violence

## Drug Misusers

2225 opiate/crack users living in Surrey have not been in treatment in last 2 years.
